1. The University

The university was founded in 1914 and has 4 locations: **Campus Westend** (law, economics, social sciences and the humanities) **Campus Riedberg** (natural and life sciences) **Campus Niederrad** (university hospital) **Campus Bockenheim** (humanities, maths, computer science) **Campus Ginnheim** (Sports science)

Broad spectrum of fields and large student body approx. 47,000 students, around 7.300 international students 16 faculties (Law, Humanities, Life, Natural and Social Sciences)

4. Purpose of Study

Great job market:

44.000 companies offer some 450,000 jobs in the area. Students can benefit from interesting opportunities for internships and part-time employment, e.g. at the Frankfurt fair or at the airport.

Frankfurt is the financial centre of Germany with 350 banks, including the European Central Bank, 150 foreign banks, and the fourth largest stock exchange in the world.

Career service:

We care about our international students and try to help find a suitable job! Goethe University's **Career Service** offers courses of particular interest for international students. Please note that all international students are allowed to stay on after graduation if they meet the **legal requirements** (§18 Residence Act). In order to arrange your accommodation, your first point of contact is the "**Studentenwerk**" (organisation for the wellbeing of students), because the university does not guarantee accomodation.
